ABOUT VILLA HECTOR

CLEANING

The property is cleaned twice a week – arrival day and midweek.

HOT WATER

The water is heated by the use of both solar power and a diesel boiler system. Hot water should be available at all times. If otherwise, please contact your Representative.

ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES: WASHING MACHINE/ DISHWASHER

The washing machine is located in the large bathroom on the first floor. The dishwasher is located in the kitchen. If you are having trouble with any of the appliances, please contact your Representative.

AIR CONDITIONING

The air conditioning is operated by remote control. The usual temperature is around 22°C. All doors and windows should be closed for air conditioning to function properly.

KEYS

The keys to your property can be found in the front door and instructions on where to leave them will be given in your departure letter. We would ask that you take good care of the keys to the property. In the unlikely event you were to lose the keys, please contact your representative and you will be provided with a spare set.

However, should it be necessary to change the locks for security reasons as a result of lost keys, we reserved the right to make a charge for which you may be liable for. We would ask that you also be mindful when you are outside the property and around the pool area not to lock yourselves out. This can happen easily as the wind can slam doors very quickly. Should you get locked out, contact your representative. Please note any extra keys are for use only in emergency – we cannot provide spare keys as a matter of course.

SWIMMING POOL

The pool is cleaned on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.

WATER

The property's tap water is drinkable but we would still advise you to consume bottled water.

INTERNET

Wifi connection is free of charge. Details of passwords will be given in your welcome letter.

FIRE NOTICE

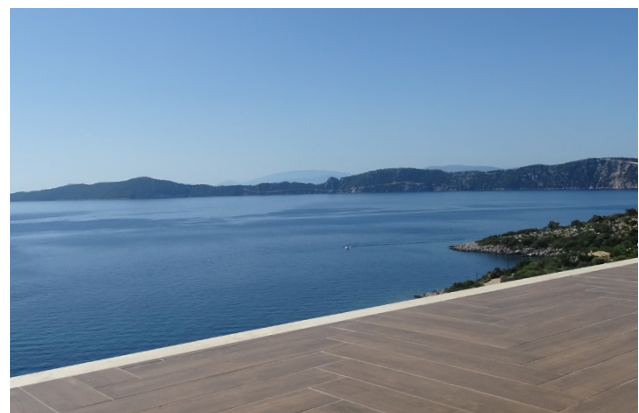
Fire drill instructions can be found in your property.

The safe is located in the master bedroom and is operated by a key.

LOST PROPERTY

Please ensure all personal possessions are packed when leaving your accommodation. Whilst we will endeavour to assist when items are left, unfortunately we are unable to guarantee the return of any items which have been left unattended and will not be liable for any items lost or damaged. If we are able to locate your lost item, postage, packaging and handling fees may apply for the return of the lost items.



LOCAL AMENITIES

SHOPS

The nearest shops are in Vathi.

BANK

There are no banks on the island of Meganisi, but there are two ATMs in Vathi. Your nearest bank can be found in Nidri, Lefkada, 30 minutes by ferry, leaving from Spartochori.

MINI MARKET

Your three nearest mini markets are located in Vathi. You will find them open from early in the morning until around 8.00pm.

PHARMACY

The island's pharmacy is situated in the capital, Katomeri. Generally, the pharmacy will remain closed, as part of its 'siesta' break, between 2.00pm and 6.00pm daily. For more information please contact your Representative.

MEDICAL CENTRE

The medical centre in Meganisi is located in Katomeri, with two doctors on duty during the day. Should you require more information please contact your Representative.

DENTIST

There is no dentist on the island of Meganisi. Your nearest dentist is located in Nidri High Street, on the island of Lefkada. However, we advise you to contact your representative should you require more information or want to book an appointment.

BAKERY

You will find a bakery in Vathi, on the road to Katomeri Village.

RESTAURANTS

Visit Vathi, where you will find a plethora of restaurants ranging from traditional Greek tavernas to Italian cuisine to wine bars.

BEACHES

Some of the nearby beaches are Atherinos, Limonari and Fanarakia beach.

POST OFFICE

There is no post office on Meganisi, but there is a post box from which mail will be collected.

PETROL STATION

The island of Meganisi only has one petrol station, located right outside the village of Spartochori.

HEALTH & SAFETY

To help ensure that your holiday will be both happy and safe, we would kindly ask that you take the time to read the following information. Part of the enjoyment of traveling abroad is experiencing a different way of life. Please remember though, that it may also mean experiencing different standards from those we are used to at home. We are continually working to raise safety standards in all of our properties and will of course do our best to ensure that your holiday is safe and trouble-free, but we do ask that you take extra care while you are away. With this in mind, we would like to highlight the following important points.

FIRE SAFETY

Other countries have different fire safety regulations and procedures. Please read carefully all safety information available in your property and in this information book. When you first arrive, please make sure you familiarise yourself with the location of the fire exits and the location of all fire extinguishers. To help avoid the risk of fire, please take particular care when cooking and using the barbecue.

IN THE UNLIKELY EVENT OF A FIRE:

- RAISE THE ALARM.
- CALL THE FIRE BRIGADE - 199.
- DO NOT PANIC Leave the building. Do not stop to take personal belongings with you.
- IF THE EXITS/STAIRS ARE BLOCKED keep the doors shut and try to get out onto a balcony for fresh air and to attract attention.
- DO NOT RE-ENTER THE BUILDING - AWAIT FOR CLEARANCE FROM THE FIRE BRIGADE.

BATHROOMS

In common with many Mediterranean countries, your bathroom will probably have a marble or tiled floor. Shower curtains are not always provided and most bathrooms do not have non-slip mats in either the bath or shower, so extra care must be taken when the floor is wet, particularly with children. Due to the size of the standard bore sewerage pipe used, Greek toilets cannot properly dispose of any paper or other

waste material. To avoid blockages, please ensure that all paper, nappies and sanitary items are placed in the bin provided, which will be emptied regularly.

GLASS PANELS/DOORS

Although most properties have safety stickers on glass doors this may not always be the case, so particular care should be taken when walking through glass patio doors, as it can be difficult to tell if they are open or closed.

SECURITY AND VALUABLES

Where available, it is generally advisable to use the safety deposit facilities, or hotel safe, at your property, particularly for valuables.

WATER

Although tap water is purified it can cause upset stomachs and so it is best to drink bottled water, which may be purchased in local shops. To avoid dehydration and the effects of the sun it is advisable to drink water, in addition to other drinks you may consume.

PLUMBING

Drainage systems in Greece are not always efficient as small bore pipes are often used. A blockage will cause considerable inconvenience and during the summer season plumbers can be hard to find. To avoid problems of this nature, please do not put any products other than a small amount of toilet paper into the toilet. A bin is provided in the bathroom for disposable nappies and other sanitary products.

RUBBISH DISPOSAL

The maid will dispose of your rubbish on visits to the property. If you wish to dispose of rubbish in between visits, your Representative will advise you of the nearest disposal bin. Please keep the lid on the bin and tie any rubbish sacks up securely to stop any rodent/insect infestation.

HEALTH AND SAFETY (CONTINUED)

GAS SAFETY

If your accommodation has a gas cooker, always double check that it has been turned off properly just as you would at home. Please follow any Gas Safety instructions provided. In many cases you will find that the gas is supplied direct from a bottle - as an extra precaution, turn the supply off at the bottleneck when it is not in use. Never attempt to locate a gas leak yourself or tamper with the gas supply. If you are unsure about how any of the gas appliances operate or have any queries or concerns please ask your Representative for assistance and advice.

SMOKING MATERIALS

Please take care when discarding matches, cigarettes etc. Always use the ashtrays provided. Never throw a cigarette end carelessly within the grounds or outside, especially near trees and plants. In summer the vegetation can be tinder-dry and fires can start all too easily. Please note that it is absolutely prohibited to use any type of flammable materials inside the villa.

KEYS

Please be careful when you are outside the villa not to lock yourselves out. This can happen easily as the wind can slam doors very quickly! Should you get locked out keys are held by the maids and your Representative. Please note that these extra keys are for use only in emergency - we cannot provide spare keys as a matter of course.

SUNBATHING

A healthier colour makes us all feel better, but taking too much sun can be both painful and dangerous. Build up your tan gradually by minimising your exposure during the first few days of your holiday. Remember the sun's rays are at their strongest between the hours of 11.00 to 15.00.

- Always use a sunscreen that protects against UVA and UVB (ultra violet) and has a high SPF (sun protection factor).
- Avoid midday sun, but if you have to go out, cover up with loose clothing and wear a wide brimmed hat.

- Never expose babies under six months to direct sunlight.
- Remember you can still burn in the shade, when it's cloudy or when you're swimming. Wind and water intensify the sun's effect, so while you may feel cool, you could be burning. Always re-apply sunscreen after swimming.
- Where possible, seek natural shade.

SWIMMING POOL SAFETY

You will find that many swimming pools are not designed in the same way as the UK and may have unusual features. Take care when walking around the pool, as pool surrounds are often slippery when wet. Do not use the pool if you cannot see the bottom and do not tamper with the pool filter covers, report any defects to your Representative immediately. In general, pools do not have a lifeguard so we strongly recommend that you read through this Swimming Pool Safety section.

NEVER put any liquids or chemicals into the pool yourself. The pool pump house housing the pump and filtration equipment should normally be locked and not accessible. However, if for some reason the pump house is open, perhaps for access to the "Pool Lights" switch, NEVER touch any of the equipment. Keep children out of the pump house at all times. If pool chemicals such as chlorine and acid are in the pump house, under no circumstances touch them and ask your Representative to have them removed to a safe place. Concentrated chlorine and acid will cause severe burns on contact with skin.

Please take a few minutes to read this information and familiarise yourself with the points mentioned below:

- Please note that the pool is unattended and therefore you are responsible for the safety of any children and non-swimmers in your party to act responsibly around the pool area.
- Diving is NOT permitted.



- If you are at a shared pool please consider others and be respectful of other swimmers.
- Please familiarise yourself on arrival with the depth of the pool. In particular the deep and shallow ends as well as the steepness of the slopes. Pay close attention to the depth markings.
- Shower before and after using the pool – this will help maintain good hygiene standards, keep the pool clean and functioning properly.
- Please do not swim in the pool after using suntan lotions or oils as this can damage the filter systems.
- It is your responsibility to ensure children in your party are supervised at all times when using the pool and the surrounding areas.
- Please do not run or allow children to run around the pool areas.
- Please remove all toys and swimming aids from the pool and the pool area when the pool is no longer in use and when an adult is not supervising the area.
- Please avoid using drinking glasses, bottles and anything breakable around the pool area.
- No alcohol should be consumed before or during the use of the swimming pool.
- Should the weather turn windy, please ensure any parasols are closed or where possible removed from the pool area. Please ensure they are also closed when not in use.
- Beware of slippery surfaces and raised edges in and around the pool.
- Do not tamper with the pool filter covers, pool lights or any pool equipment.

DRIVING

Driving overseas can be great fun and a good way to explore. However, conditions and procedures can differ to those we are familiar with in the UK. The rules of the road can be very different, drivers are not always obliged to stop at pedestrian crossings and you may need to look the other way when crossing the road! Please be fully aware of the local regulations regarding the "Highway Code". Information on speed limits can be obtained from the car hire company.

Never drink and drive, as it is an offence.

EXPLORING KATOMERI

Home to the island's only hotel, our own Hotel Meganisi, the charming settlement of Katomeri is situated around an hour's walk from Spartochori with magnificent views of the island from its elevated position on the hillside. The road from the port to Katomeri is a lovely walk, and not only boasts some of the best views of the island, but also is very rarely disturbed by passing traffic, as once again, cars and mopeds are very rare along this route!

Katomeri has a small selection of tavernas, a couple of bars, and a traditional caffeine within its pretty narrow alleyways, and is also home to the island's only petrol station.

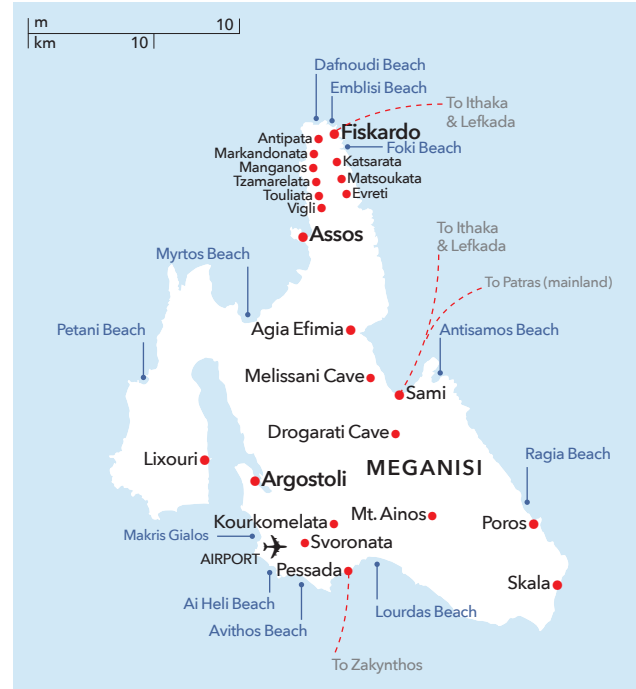


EXPLORING MEGANISI

Located along the Western side of the Greek mainland, the Ionian is made up of seven unique islands dotted along the beautiful coastline. From norther-most Corfu, just off the tip of Albania, down to Zakynthos which reaches as far as the Peloponnese near the Greek mainland, each island has a wealth of history, culture and tradition, which, coupled with stretches of some of the best beaches in Europe makes for a perfect holiday destination.

Meganisi is simply another world, tranquil, almost sleepy and very relaxing. Only twenty square kilometres in area, yet somewhat paradoxically named 'large island', Meganisi is an island which is often rejected in favour of its larger neighbour Lefkada, making it, still blissfully unspoilt.

Reached by boat from Nidri, passing Skorpios, the contrast between the bustle of that busy resort and the quiet solitude of Meganisi's lonely bays and traffic free lanes couldn't be more marked. With just three or four villages, hardly more than hamlets in reality and almost no tourist development, this is the perfect island to escape from the stresses and strains of a busy life. Even the entrance to Vathi, the island's main harbour is watched over by twin churches to bless those arriving and leaving.



Mythology tells us that King Tafios, a son of Poseidon, was the founder of the town of Tafion. Later, according to Homer's Odyssey, Ulysses gave his fleet to Mentor, the Tafion king at the time, when he left for Troy. Tafion is the island we now know as Meganisi. He would no doubt be comforted to see that there have not been a lot of changes to his beloved island since he was last there!

There are a number of beaches within walking distance of our accommodation. Spilia, close to the little port of Spartochori has a pebble strand, Ambelakia on the north coast is one of a string of beaches that can be reached by walking. Alternatively, caiques from Vathi can be taken there.

Another way to enjoy this remarkable island is to join one of the regular round island boat trips from Nidri which have the added attraction of visiting the famous shipping magnate, Aristotle Onassis' island of Skorpios and the other smaller islands. Other boats visit Ithaka, Kefalonia and the inner islands on a regular basis.

Walking is excellent on the island and the only real method of travel to truly reveal the wonderful views and perspectives of the island and to visit the tranquil and uncrowded beaches that are dotted around the island. Below some of the pathways or monpaths, steep cliffs are honey-combed with caves, only accessible by boat, some even large enough, so the story goes, to hide submarines during World War Two. Meganisi is one of the most picturesque and peaceful in the Ionian. Having a population of less than 2,000 it is also one of the smallest. This is real Greece!

SPILIA

The smaller of Meganisi's two ports, reached first when traveling by ferry from Nidri, Spilia is situated just in front of the charming village of Spartochori. Unlike the larger settlement of Vathi, Spilia is more of a landing stage than a port, situated on a pebble beach in the north of the island, but it is still an important part of the island nevertheless, functioning as a gateway between Meganisi and Lefkada. It has a choice of three waterfront tavernas, and a short walk around the bay leads to a longer sandy beach with a further selection of snack bars. There is also an unofficial campsite by the bay, where shop and shower facilities can be found.

VATHI

The largest of Meganisi's two ports, Vathi is a charming and traditional fishing village, flanked with churches originally erected to bless all boats with safe passage to and from the island. Not much has changed here for hundreds of years and the main action still revolves around the arrival and departure of the daily ferry from Nidri to Lefkada. Vathi has a selection of waterfront tavernas and cafés from which to watch the action in the harbour, and one or two have an excellent choice of freshly caught seafood dishes. Vathi is a good choice for an evening out, being easily

accessible from the hotel in around 10 minutes stroll downhill – although don't forget that you will need to walk back up again to get home!

PAPANICOLIS CAVE

Like the fantastic landscape of the southern coast of her larger neighbour, Lefkada, Meganisi also boasts a rugged coastline of white rocks that give way to the fascinating Papanicolis Cave. This stunning cave is situated on the south west coast of the island and accessible only by winding footpath or by boat, but is well worth a visit – particularly enjoyable for those of you that have opted for motorboat hire, who will be able to enjoy the views from within the cave, where crystal waters allow the white rocks below to be viewed as deep as 20 feet down.

The cave is said to have been used as a safe haven for many sailors over the years, most notably during the World War II when a submarine was hidden here from the Germans and used as a base for carrying on operations against the occupying forces in 1941.

SPARTOCHORI

Tucked away behind the port of Spilia and high up on the cliff overlooking the bay on the north

of the island, is the pretty village of Spartochoiri. Ten minutes' walk from the port, this village although small, is full of traditional Greek charm and character, with excellent views over the water and out to the islands of Lefkada, Skorprios and Madouri. The village has remained unchanged for many years, having only gained electricity in 1973, and until recent years the village had just two cars which served all of the inhabitants! Certainly not much has changed since then, as the roads are extremely narrow and much skill is required to manoeuvre anything more than a moped around the twisting roads and alleyways of the village. It is much easier and probably more enjoyable to explore on foot, as tourism has done little to alter the character of this sleepy town – although in addition to the small selection of traditional tavernas and shops there is now one souvenir shop and a pizzeria!

An easy twenty minute walk west along the new road from Spartochoiri will bring you to the excellent beach of Agios Ioannis. This is the best beach of the island and is the one place that you may be likely to find anything resembling crowds – although even here this is pretty unlikely! There is one taverna on the beach.

AGIOS IOANNIS

An easy twenty minute walk west along the new road from Spartochori, will bring you to the excellent beach of Agios Ioannis. This is the best beach on the island, and with it's taverna, is the one place that you may find something resembling a crowd - although even here this is pretty unlikely!



FANARI

This picturesque pebbly beach with its crystal clear waters, surrounded by lush vegetation, is located 3 km north of Katomeri. Fanari beach should be your first choice if you are looking for an isolated beach where you can swim and sunbathe in peace.

AMBELAKIA

This is the nearest beach to Vathi, situated on the north coast and only a 15 minute walk east of Vathi harbour. It is the largest beach of the island and boasts a good stretch of golden sand.

BARBAREZOU

The beautiful and quiet beach of Barbarezou is situated 5 km east of Katomeri. Many people visit the beach by boat, although there is a road taking you to this pebbly cove.

PASOUMAKI

3 km northwest of Katomeri you will find the beach of Pasoumaki. This small cove, only a few minutes away from Vathi, is frequented because of its clear waters, natural shade and relaxing atmosphere.

SPILIA

This clean, pebbly beach is surrounded by greenery offering natural shade. It's located at the far end of Spartochori bay and there you will find a few Greek tavernas to enjoy traditional dishes. From the village of Spartochori you can enjoy a beautiful view of the entire bay.

LOCAL FOODS

The island of Meganisi promises to offer a rich gastronomic experience with dishes made of fresh ingredients and home made pastries. Throughout the island you will find a plethora of luxurious Greek restaurants, traditional tavernas and plenty of diverse eateries offering quality international cuisine.

FETA CHEESE

Made of sheep's and goat's milk and produced in blocks, feta is the most popular Greek cheese used in lots of Greek dishes, salads and even pastries. High quality feta should have the aroma of ewe's milk, yoghurt and butter, together with a smooth and thick texture.

COURGETTE BALLS

GREEK COFFEE

There are lovers and there are haters. People who have tried the Greek coffee, also known as Turkish - although you are better off ordering it as 'Greek' - have either fallen in love with its strong coffee smell and thick texture or have found it hard to even get a sip off the cup. Order this unfiltered coffee with a spoon of sugar, otherwise you will be joining the haters in no time.

GALAKTOBOUREKO

For the majority of Greeks, Galaktoboureko is the tastiest sweet in the country. Made of home made pastry and custard filling with eggs, milk and sugar, Galaktoboureko resembles the French mille-feuille. Unlike the French delicacy though, in this instance, the custard is baked with the pastry.

GREEK SALAD

In most bakeries you will be offered the savoury version of the pastry as well. You can find the Bougatsa where in place of custard, the pie will be filled with cheese or minced meat.

HONEY

GREEN LIVING

We at Ionian Island Holidays take an active role in assuring that we do our utmost to be energy aware and we do all we can to aid conservation to help the environment. We know many of our guests want to conserve energy and water, so here are a few tips to help you during your stay.



WATER CONSERVATION

- Turn taps off when brushing your teeth or shaving.
- Take shorter showers: recommended time 4 mins.
- Fully load the washing machine/dishwasher OR, if not full, use the half load button if available.
- Use lower economy settings on washing machines and dishwashers.
- Do not leave taps running unnecessarily.



ENERGY CONSERVATION

- Switch off lights when not in use.
- Kettles use lots of electricity – so only boil what you need and don't overfill.
- Don't leave TVs/DVD-players/Radios on standby – this still uses a lot of electricity.
- Don't leave your mobile phone or other device charger plugged into the socket when not charging, as this still draws on electricity.
- If it's not too hot, instead of using the air-conditioning, open doors and windows and let the cool summer breezes in.
- To maximise air-conditioning, ensure external doors and windows are shut (air-conditioning in some properties will not work otherwise).
- Optimum air-conditioning temperature is 22-24°C, helping conserve energy and preventing units from potentially freezing up and causing water leakage (Remember, it's not recommended to sleep with air-conditioning as you may catch a chill).
- If the hot water switch is on, make sure it is turned off when not needed.

The money raised will help local animal charities to purchase vaccinations, microchipping neutering and paying vets bills, feeding, fostering and rehoming.

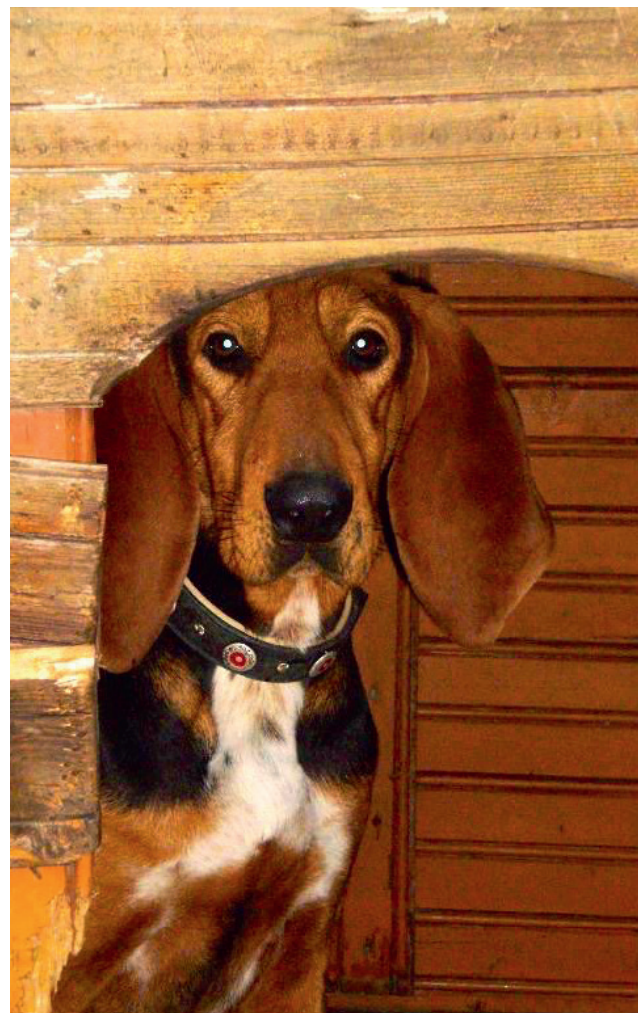
Your donations will save the many lives of dogs, cats even donkeys, mules and horses and as all our chosen charities are run by volunteers all the donations go directly to helping the animals.
