ABOUT VILLA AMANDA

CLEANING

The property is cleaned on Tuesday and Friday. If you wish to empty the rubbish yourself in between visits, you can always use the municipal bin at 300m from your property.

HOT WATER

The water is heated by the use of a boiler system. Hot water should be available at all times. If otherwise, please contact your Representative.

ELECTRIC APPLIANCES

Instructions on how to operate the washing machine and the dishwasher can be found in the villa info book, in the sitting room. If you are having trouble with any of the appliances, please contact your Representative.

AIR CONDITIONING

The air conditioning is operated by a remote control. The usual temperature is around 22°C.

KEYS

The keys to your property can be found in the front door and instructions on where to leave them will be given in your departure letter. We would ask that you take good care of the keys to the property as if they are your own. In the unlikely event you were to lose the keys, please contact your Representative and you will be provided with a spare set.

However, should it be necessary to change the locks for security reasons as a result of lost keys, we reserve the right



to make a charge for which you may be liable for. We would ask that you also be mindful when you are outside the villa and around the pool area not to lock yourselves out. This can happen easily as the wind can slam doors very quickly.

Should you get locked out contact your Representative.

Please note that these extra keys are for use only in emergency - we cannot provide spare keys as a matter of course.

WATER

The property's tap water is not drinkable. We advise you to consume bottled water.

FIRE NOTICE

Fire drill instructions can be found in your property.

INTERNET

Wifi connection is free of charge. Details of passwords are given in your welcome letter.

SWIMMING POOL

The pool is cleaned twice a week.

LOST PROPERTY

Please ensure all personal possessions are packed when leaving your accommodation. Whilst we will endeavour to assist when items are left, unfortunately we are unable to guarantee the return of any items which have been left unattended and will not be liable for any items lost or damaged. If we are able to locate your lost item, postage, packaging and handling fees may apply for the return of the lost items.



HEALTH & SAFETY

To help ensure that your holiday will be both happy and safe, we would kindly ask that you take the time to read the following information.

Part of the enjoyment of traveling abroad is experiencing a different way of life. Please remember though, that it may also mean experiencing different standards from those we are used to at home. We are continually working to raise safety standards in all of our properties and will of course do our best to ensure that your holiday is safe and trouble-free, but we do ask that you take extra care while you are away. With this in mind, we would like to highlight the following important points.

FIRE SAFETY

Other countries have different fire safety regulations and procedures. Please read carefully all safety information available in your property and in this information book. When you first arrive, please make sure you familiarise yourself with the location of the fire exits and the location of all fire extinguishers.

To help avoid the risk of fire, please take particular care when cooking and using the barbecue.

IN THE UNLIKELY EVENT OF A FIRE:

- RAISE THE ALARM
- CALL THE FIRE BRIGADE 199
- DO NOT PANIC

Leave the building. Do not stop to take personal belongings with you

- IF THE EXITS/STAIRS ARE BLOCKED keep the doors shut and try to get out onto a balcony for fresh air and to attract attention
- DO NOT RE-ENTER THE BUILDING AWAIT FOR CLEARANCE FROM THE FIRE BRIGADE

BATHROOMS

In common with many Mediterranean countries, your bathroom will probably have a marble or tiled floor. Shower curtains are not always provided and most bathrooms do not have non-slip mats in either the bath or shower, so extra care must be taken when the floor is wet, particularly with children.

Due to the size of the standard bore sewerage pipe used, Greek toilets cannot properly dispose of any paper or other waste material. To avoid blockages, please ensure that all paper, nappies and sanitary items are place in the bin provided, which will be emptied regularly.

GLASS PANELS/DOORS

Although most properties have safety stickers on glass doors this may not always be the case, so particular care should be taken when walking through glass patio doors, as it can be difficult to tell if they are open or closed.

SECURITY AND VALUABLES

Where available, it is generally advisable to use the safety deposit facilities, or hotel safe, at your property, particularly for valuables.

WATER

Although tap water is purified it can cause upset stomachs and so it is best to drink bottled water, which may be purchased in local shops. To avoid dehydration and the effects of the sun it is advisable to drink water, in addition to other drinks you may consume.

PLUMBING

Drainage systems Greece are not always efficient as small bore pipes are often used. A blockage will cause considerable inconvenience and during the summer season plumbers can be hard to find. To avoid problems of this nature, please do not put any products other than a small amount of toilet paper into the toilet. A bin is provided in the bathroom for disposable nappies and other sanitary products.

RUBBISH DISPOSAL

The maid will dispose of your rubbish on visits to the property. If you wish to dispose of rubbish in between visits, your Representative will advise you of the nearest disposal bin. Please keep the lid on the bin and tie any rubbish sacks up securely to stop any rodent/insect infestation.

GAS SAFETY

If your accommodation has a gas cooker, always double check that it has been turned off properly just as you would at home. Please follow any Gas Safety instructions provided. In many cases you will find that the gas is supplied direct from a bottle - as an extra precaution, turn the supply off at the bottleneck when it is not in use.

Never attempt to locate a gas leak yourself or tamper with the gas supply. If you are unsure about how any of the gas appliances operate or have any queries or concerns please ask your Representative for assistance and advice.

SMOKING MATERIALS

Please take care when discarding matches, cigarettes etc. Always use the ashtrays provided. Never throw a cigarette end carelessly within the grounds or outside, especially near trees and plants. In summer the vegetation can be tinder-dry and fires can start all too easily. Please note that it is absolutely prohibited to use any type of flammable materials inside the villa.

KEYS

Please be careful when you are outside the villa not to lock yourselves out. This can happen easily as the wind can slam doors very quickly! Should you get locked out keys are held by the maids and your Representative. Please note that these extra keys are for use only in emergency - we cannot provide spare keys as a matter of course.

SUNBATHING

A healthier colour makes us all feel better, but taking too much sun can be both painful and dangerous. Build up your tan gradually by minimising your exposure during the first few days of your holiday. Remember the sun's rays are at their strongest between the hours of 11.00 to 15.00.

- Always use a sunscreen that protects against UVA and UVB (ultra violet) and has a high SPF (sun protection factor)
- Avoid midday sun, but if you have to go out, cover up with loose clothing and wear a wide brimmed hat
- Never expose babies under six months to direct sunlight
- Remember you can still burn in the shade, when it's cloudy or when you're swimming.
 Wind and water intensify the sun's effect, so while you may feel cool, you could be burning. Always re-apply sunscreen after swimming
- Where possible, seek natural shade

SWIMMING POOL SAFETY

You will find that many swimming pools are not designed in the same way as the UK and may have unusual features. Take care when walking around the pool, as pool surrounds are often slippery when wet. Do not use the pool if you cannot see the bottom and do not tamper with the pool filter covers, report any defects to your Representative immediately. In general, pools do not have a lifeguard so we strongly recommend that you read through this Swimming Pool Safety section.

NEVER put any liquids or chemicals into the pool yourself. The pool pump house housing the pump and filtration equipment should normally be locked and not accessible. However, if for some reason the pump house is open, perhaps for access to the "Pool Lights" switch, NEVER touch any of the equipment. Keep children out of the pump house at all times. If pool chemicals such as chlorine and acid are in the pump house, under no circumstances touch them and ask your Representative to have them removed to a safe place. Concentrated chlorine and acid will cause severe burns on contact with skin.

Please take a few minutes to read this information and familiarise yourself with the points mentioned below.


- Please note that the pool is unattended and therefore you are responsible for the safety of any children and non-swimmers in your party to act responsibly around the pool area.
- Diving is NOT permitted.
- If you are at a shared pool please consider others and be respectful of other swimmers.
- Please familiarise yourself on arrival with the depth of the pool. In particular the deep and shallow ends as well as the steepness of the slopes.
 Pay close attention to the depth markings.
- Shower before and after using the pool - this will help maintain good hygiene standards, keep the pool clean and functioning properly.
- Please do not swim in the pool after using suntan lotions or oils as this can damage the filter systems.
- It is your responsibility to ensure children in your party are supervised at all times when using the pool and the surrounding areas.

- Please do not run or allow children to run around the pool areas.
- Please remove all toys and swimming aids from the pool and the pool area when the pool is no longer in use and when an adult is not supervising the area.
- Please avoid using drinking glasses, bottles and anything breakable around the pool area.
- No alcohol should be consumed before or during the use of the swimming pool.
- Should the weather turn windy, please ensure any parasols are closed or where possible removed from the pool area. Please ensure they are also closed when not in use.
- Beware of slippery surfaces and raised edges in and around the pool.
- Do not tamper with the pool filter covers, pool lights or any pool equipment.

DRIVING

Driving overseas can be great fun and a good way to explore. However, conditions and procedures can differ to those we are familiar with in the UK. The rules of the road can be very different, drivers are not always obliged to stop at pedestrian crossings and you may need to look the other way when crossing the road! Please be fully aware of the local regulations regarding the "Highway Code". Information on speed limits can be obtained from the car hire company.

GREEN LIVING

We at Ionian Island Holidays take an active role in assuring that we do our utmost to be energy aware and we do all we can to aid conservation to help the environment. We know many of our guests want to conserve energy and water, so here are a few tips to help you during your stay

WATER CONSERVATION

- Turn taps off when brushing your teeth or shaving
- Take shorter showers: recommended time 4 mins
- Fully load the washing machine/ dishwasher OR, if not full, use the half load button if available
- Use lower economy settings on washing machines and dishwashers
- Do not leave taps running unnecessarily



ENERGY CONSERVATION

- Switch off lights when not in use
- Kettles use lots of electricity so only boil what you need and don't overfill
- Don't leave TVs/DVD-players/Radios on standby - this still uses a lot of electricity
- Don't leave your mobile phone or other device charger plugged into the socket when not charging, as this still draws on electricity
- If it's not too hot, instead of using the air-conditioning, open doors and windows and let the cool summer breezes in
- To maximise air-conditioning, ensure external doors and windows are shut (air-conditioning in some properties will not work otherwise)
- Optimum air-conditioning temperature is 22-24°, helping conserve energy and preventing units from potentially freezing up and causing water leakage (Remember, it's not recommended to sleep with air-conditioning as you may catch a chill)
- If the hot water switch is on, make sure it is turned off when not needed

EXPLORING SKIATHOS TOWN

Built like an amphitheatre around a sheltered bay, Skiathos Town is a picturesque mixture of red tile roofs, white buildings and bell towers. A cosmopolitan little capital, there is a wealth of restaurants, both Greek and international, tavernas, cafés, bars and clubs.

During the day it is busy with the hustle and bustle of the locals, their fishing boats and the arrival of numerous ferries. At night the whole area is transformed into an array of waterfront restaurants and cafes welcoming locals and visitors alike.

The harbour front features several cafés, tavernas, and some exceptional seafood restaurants - enjoy the spoils of the crystal blue waters with a bottle of local wine in the vibrant marina area.



LOCAL AMENITIES

SHOPS

You will find plenty of souvenir shops and boutiques in Skiathos town. During peak summer season the shops will stay open from early in the morning until late at night.

BANK

Your nearest bank is located in Skiathos town, at a 20 minute walk from your property. You will find it open Monday to Thursday, 8.00am to 2.30pm and Friday 8.00am to 2.00pm.

SUPERMARKET

The nearest supermarket to your property is located on the main road, at the edge of Skiathos town, again, at a 20 minute walk. The supermarket is open 7 days a week, from 8.30am to 9.00pm.

PHARMACY

There are three chemists in Skiathos town. One in the middle and one at the top of Skiathos main street; the third one is behind the old port.

Opening hours are from 9.00am to 1.30pm and 5.30pm – 9.00pm. One of these three chemists will open out of hours in case of emergency.

DOCTOR

There is no hospital in Skiathos but the Health Centre deals with most medical problems. It is situated at the top of Skiathos town and is well sign posted. It is manned 24 hours a day, although surgery hours are 8.30am – 2.00pm on weekdays. Afternoons and weekends are for emergencies only. There is a small charge of 5 euros for treatment.

A private doctor's surgery is located in Evangelistria Street just off the main street in Skiathos town.

Opening hours are 9.00am to 8.00pm, Monday to Saturday. The doctor will also visit accommodation at any time if required. Should you require more information please contact your Representative.

DENTIST

There are two dentists in Skiathos town. One at the top of the main street in the Acropolis area and one in the middle of the main street nearly opposite the National Bank of Greece branch. Should you require more information please contact your Representative.

BAKERY

Your nearest bakery is 3km away from your property, located on the ring road around Skiathos town.

RESTAURANTS

You will find a plethora of restaurants, traditional Greek tavernas and bars around Skiathos town.

BEACHES

One of your nearest bays is the beautiful and sandy Achladies beach. At 4km from your property you will also find the beach of Megali Ammos, meaning 'Big Sand'.

POST OFFICE

In Skiathos town you will also find a post office. The opening hours are Monday to Friday, 7.30am to 2.00pm.

PETROL STATION

Four petrol stations can be found on the ring road, one at Megali Ammos, 2km from Skiathos town, and another one at Troulos, 8km from the town. All of them stay open 7 days a week, 8.30am to 9.00pm.

EXPLORING SKIATHOS

Skiathos is deservedly the most popular of the Sporades Islands because, despite its relatively small size, there is something for every one here. Popular beaches, with a wide choice of watersports, a bustling ferry-port and main town, and an interior little changed over the centuries.

There is much more to the island than its sixty eight famous magnificent sandy beaches, fantastic watersports and resorts offering a cosmopolitan and sophisticated nightlife.

The west coast, for instance is spectacular and almost undeveloped. It appeals to those who enjoy wild and lonely landscapes with hidden valleys, wooded hillsides and cliff top paths. The air is filled with the scent of aromatic herbs and the only sounds are the waves breaking far below or bells sounding from a tiny village church.

The interior is rural with olive groves, pine woods and hillsides that few explore. Small, traditional houses can be found whose architecture blends in with the

classical mansions in graceful Venetian styles.

The beautiful island of Skiathos is small enough to allow you to explore fully the outstanding beauty of the area steeped in history and seemingly quite unchanged by the passing of time. Breathtaking scenery and gentle tracks and pathways lead you into an aspect of Greece you imagine from literature and photographs. Here is a place to unwind and relax, yet you have the advantage of some of the most beautiful beaches rivaling any elsewhere in the world. On this island there are in fact over sixty sandy beaches for you to choose from!

The history of Skiathos is also fascinating. The Cretans were amongst the earliest settlers here and its present name may be derived from the Cretan "Skiathos" or Dionysis. The Ionians came here in the 8th century BC and must have been pleased to discover an island as green and fertile as their own!

Over the following centuries up until the birth of Christ, the island allied itself at different times with Sparta and Athens. It was during this period that Skiathos became famous for the quality of its ships, shipwrights and sailors, using timber from the magnificent pine forests that covered the island.

This tradition continued into the Byzantine era, but unfortunately the island's reputation for the quality of its timber and boat building, as well as its natural produce, became a magnet for the pirates that terrorised the Aegean. In fact, the islanders invited the Venetians to take possession of the island and the first major fortress at Bourtzi was built by two Italian brothers. The site is now a popular and interesting cultural centre that is well worth a visit. The island changed hands regularly over the next three centuries according to the fortunes of the Ottoman and Venetian Empires.



In 1807, the first Greek Flag was designed, woven, blessed and raised at the Monastery of The Annunciation on Skiathos, the island became a special place in the history of the Greek struggle for independence.

Modern Skiathos is very much like its larger Ionian counterpart, Corfu. It has magnificent beaches, bustling resorts with a cosmopolitan and sophisticated nightlife on the one hand, but also quiet, secret valleys, wooded hillsides and cliff top paths the air filled with waves breaking far or a bell sounding the hours from a tiny village church. An island of contrast with something for everyone.

EVANGELISTRIA MONASTERY MONASTERY OF THE ANNUNCIATION

Founded during the Byzantine period, the monastery is set in a beautiful and dramatic location up on a hill and surrounded by pine and cypress trees. In 1807, the first Greek flag was designed, woven, blessed and raised here, marking a special place in the history for the island during the Greek struggle for independence from the Turks. Topped by three domes, the interior boasts a number of frescos and an amazing iconostasis. There is also a museum with exhibits which include Byzantine icons, lituraical vessels, vestments, and so on. The monastery is situated 4km north of Skiathos Town and is accessible by car or by the local bus service.

KASTRO

Built in the 14th Century and enlarged during the Venetian occupation, this ruined city on the north east tip, was the former fortified capital of the island. It's dramatic hilltop setting provided a necessary vantage point looking out to sea for pirates and other invaders. Only the original gate of the old fort, two churches, and a section of the fortress wall, remain, but it makes for an interesting visit. Day trip boats stop on the beach below and there are long flights of steps to take you up, or you can walk there along the dirt tracks through the forests above Skiathos Town.

OPEN-AIR CINEMA ATTIKON

Just off the port in Skiathos Town, this open-roofed hall with bougainvillea growing up the walls and director's chairs for seating, shows 3 different movies twice a day during high season. A bar at the back allows you to buy drinks or light

snacks to enjoy whilst watching the film. Screenings of Mamma Mia! are popular and can end up with audience members getting up to dance!

PAPADIAMANTIS HOUSE MUSEUM

One of Greece's most celebrated authors and a simple, religious man, Alexandros Papadiamantis (1851-1911) was born and died on the island. His home in Skiathos Town has been turned into a museum with displays relating to his life - well-worth a visit.

There are a few little islands lying just off the coast of Skiathos, opposite Skiathos Town, which are accessible by regular boat trips (caique) from Skiathos Town, or by motorboat which you can hire privately.

TSOUGRIA

The largest and most visited of these islands, Tsougria, has a couple of lovely, quiet, shallow beaches with crystal clear turquoise waters and a cantina on each with drinks and light snacks.

TSOUGRIAKI or 'BIRD' ISLAND

This small, rocky and secluded island is nicknamed 'Bird Island' due to the number of birds nesting here. A quiet little place with small beaches, but perfect to get away from it all.

ARKOS

This little island has great views of Skiathos, including Skiathos Town, and late-opening cantina offers an alternative evening out.



TOP BEACHES

KOUKOUNARIES BEACH

This is the most famous beach of Skiathos, therefore the most crowded. A kilometer long, it is well-known for it's extremely fine white sand and its fragrant pine tree forest from which the region took it's name. It is considered as the most unspoiled natural beach of the Mediterranean and is a protected

environment. The beautiful, crystal-clear, deep blue waters are a real pleasure. The beach, being well organised, offers many water sports, chairs, parasols, and beach bars.

The region around the beach is full of restaurants, tavernas, and hotels. A local bus links this beach to the capital every 30 minutes. A biotope can be found in the pine forest bordering the beach where different plant and bird species are protected. This place, as well as the beach, is developed for ecotourism, financed by the Municipality and the EU.

AGIA PARASKEVI/PLATANIAS BEACH

Near the hill village of Kolios, and named after the little church of Agia Paraskevi (Saint Friday), this large, golden sandy beach boasts tavernas, watersport facilities such as waterskiing and jet skiing, as well as motorboat hire.



ACHLADIES BEACH

Situated 2km from the capital, this sandy beach is situated in a small cove. It is fully equipped with sunbeds, parasols and a cantina/taverna. Its clear waters are suitable for all kinds of water sports: windsurfs and water skis can even be rented here. It is reachable on foot, by car, by local bus, or by boat leaving regularly from Skiathos town.

LALARIA BEACH

Accessible only by boat, this beautiful white pebble beach with crystal clear waters may not have any facilities, but it more than makes up for that in natural beauty. The cliffs at the right hand end of the beach have been sculpted by wind and sea erosion into a stack and arch.

BANANA BEACH

Another dirt road from Koukounaries continues further south and splits in two: one leads to the sandy cove called Banana, because of it's shape. It is fully equipped with sunbeds, parasols and a cantina/taverna and offers a wide range of water sports. The other end of the dirt road continues up to the little bay called 'Little Banana', a nudist beach separated from Banana Beach by a huge rock. It is smaller and quieter than it's neighbour, with fine sand and crystalline waters.

VROMOLIMNOS BEACH

Vromolimnos beach is a simply beautiful 700m long sandy beach with the clearest emerald and turquoise waters plus a fabulous beach restaurant.







LOCAL FOOD

The island of Skiathos promises to offer a rich gastronomic experience with dishes made of fresh ingredients and home made pastries. Throughout the island you will find a plethora of luxurious Greek restaurants, traditional tavernas and plenty of diverse eateries offering quality international cuisine.

FETA CHEESE

Made of sheep's and goat's milk and produced in blocks, feta is the most popular Greek cheese used in lots of Greek dishes, salads and even pastries. High quality feta should have the aroma of ewe's milk, yoghurt and butter, together with a smooth and thick texture.

COURGETTE BALLS

These lightly fried balls are certainly among the most popular starters on the Greek table - usually paired with some freshly made tzatziki.

GREEK COFFEE

There is lovers and there is haters. People who have tried the Greek coffee, also known as Turkish - although you are better off ordering it as 'Greek' - have either fallen in love with its strong coffee smell and thick texture or have found it hard to even get a sip off the cup. Order this unfiltered coffee with a spoon of sugar, otherwise you will be joining the haters in no time.

GALAKTOBOUREKO
